

General Education Requirements - PN

Though the following courses are not technically pre-requisites to the Practical Nursing Program, it is difficult to complete the coursework along with preparing for and completing clinical rotations. Therefore, it is highly recommended that these courses be completed prior to entering the first semester of the clinical nursing courses. If qualified applicants exceed program space available, candidates who have completed their General Education Requirements *may* receive priority consideration over those who have not completed these courses.

- SDV 100 - College Success Skills - 1 credit
- ENG 111 - College Composition 1- 3 credits OR ENG 137, Communications Processes 1-3 credits
- BIO 100 - Basic Human Biology - 3 credits (or BIO 141 & BIO 142 w/in 10 years)
- ITE 152 - Intro to Dig Inf Lit & Comp Ap (or ITE 119 - Information Literacy within 5 years) - 3 credits
- PSY 230 - Developmental Psychology - 3 credits
- EEE - Humanities Elective - 3 credits (Course number of 200 or higher - HUM, PHI, REL, or ENG)
- NUR 120 - Nursing Terminology - 2 credits – May substitute HLT 143, Medical Terminology 3 credits

Practical Nursing Curriculum

The Curriculum listed in our [College Catalog](#) (Scroll down for curriculum) shows how a student might complete the entire 49 required credits if General Education Courses are not completed prior to beginning the clinical program. General Education courses are listed in the latest semester in which they may be taken in the program.

- PNE Courses must be taken in sequence after acceptance into the Practical Nursing Program as listed under First Semester, Second Semester, and Third Semester.
- It is highly recommended to complete as many of the other required courses as possible prior to the First Semester of Practical Nursing (PNE).
